

In 1975, Air Force TSgt Leonard Matlovich came out as gay in order to challenge the ban. He was honorably discharged, but would continue to serve the LGBTQ+ community. His works led to the institution of Don't Ask, Don't Tell, which mitigated discrimination & harassment toward closeted homosexual and bisexual service members.


NDAA 2025

The 2025 NDAA passed the House and Senate, including a provision restricting gender-affirming care for military dependents under Tricare. This care prohibition affects trans dependents under 18 if the care risks sterilization. Despite 21 Senate Democrats introducing an amendment to remove the ban, the NDAA passed with an 85-14 vote.
